

DAVID HOLT MEMORIAL LECTURE



David Holt (1926-2002) was a highly original Jungian thinker. Born into a Liverpool Shipping family, he first had a career in book and newspaper publishing, and then he trained at the CG Jung Institute in Zurich from 1961-1966. He taught widely as well as working in private practice. His publications include *The Work of CG Jung – Essays on Construction and Deconstruction*, *Eventful Responsibility* (700 of his dreams) and *The Clermont Story* as well as numerous articles and papers.
